Legendary 18th-century New England naturalist Joe Pve was one of many who discovered that the flowering plant (upper left) that now bears his name could be used to treat everything from kidney disease to achy joints. In fact, the New England landscape has many plants with healing powers, including the Joe-Pve weed, flowering dogwood, serviceberry and lavender. Aris W. Stalis (above), a landscape architect who has redesigned the Seymour Historical Society's grounds, will speak about medicinal uses of plants throughout history.
